





1	to learning at all levels. Additionally, his use of case and cold calling for response were particularly useful at demonstrating the importance of knowing essentials of our profession so that appropriate responses are readily available in diverse settings.
2	Cold-calling and case presentation.
3	Weekly case discussions were extremely helpful to practice our EDMAs on, and also to learn from each other, to learn how to give feedback to each other.
4	The instructor incorporated tasks and materials that made the course subject matter come alive.
5	In class discussions about ethical dilemmas.

- Dr. Khan incorporated personal stories to illuminate and illustrate salient points. They were neatly tied into the course objectives and helped to demonstrate real world application of theoretical principles.
- 2 He was very supportive. He was always prepared.
- Dr. Khan treats us all equally and with extreme respect. He is a great role model, both as a professional and as a professor; he meticulously structured the course, always comes way before 9am to prepare for the course, makes all announcements in class and/or via email, always available when we have questions (even during the weekends). Very generously, he shares his personal experiences. His very adequate and appropriate use of "self-disclosure" allows us to learn from his experiences, and helps alleviate the anxiety around becoming a clinician.
- Instructor has professional and personal experience with the subject matter that lends gravitas to the "cold call" approach dreaded by so many. He was able to make us comfortable with the discomfort. His extensive experiences offered humanizing insight into the coursework.

I can not imagine starting clinical work without having taken this course. Dr. Khan created a safe place for us to be able to share our most honest opinions, and sometimes our deepest fears. We got to know each other, and learn from each other. As young psychologists, it is crucial that we adhere to the upmost moral standards, and feel somewhat prepared to work through the hardest dilemmas in the most resourceful and informed way. It will be a big challenge to practice our profession while following the institutional rules, adhering to the APA ethics code, obeying the law, and watching for our patient's needs - in terms of their treatment. This course prepared me to accept and embrace this challenge, know that there is no one right answer, and realize that I am not alone (I have my cohort, my advisor, my supervisor, etc.).
